

ROME TRAVEL STUDY: ROMAN HISTORY & CLASSICS



Explore the city of Rome and learn about its ancient history and monuments this summer.

Study the politics and culture of Rome from its earliest foundations on the Palatine hill to the triumph of the new religion of Christianity, and the subsequent collapse of an empire almost 1200 years later.



COURSE CREDITS



This course is a 24 day trip which provides insight to Rome's eras (Late Antique, Medieval, Renaissance, Baroque, Papal and secular, Fascist, and modern Rome of the 21st-century) by way of major monuments and sites. The city itself proves itself as an interactive classroom.

PROGRAM FEATURES

In this program, Rome is your actual classroom. Daily walking excursions to the major archaeological and cultural sites of the Eternal City, include ancient ruins, museums, churches, piazzas, columns, and Egyptian obelisks. Excursions to Pompeii and Tivoli are also planned.



POMPEII:

Spend a weekend (one night, optional two or three nights) stay at the well-preserved archaeological site of Roman Pompeii, an ancient city whose material culture was frozen in time by the eruption of Mount Vesuvius at the very height of the Pax Romana.



TIVOLI:

Students will take a one-day trip to picturesque
Tivoli to see Hadrian's legendary villa and the
sumptuous Villa d'Este. Between many ancient ruins,
this beautiful villa will bring the luxury of Ancient
Rome to life.



ANCIENT ROMAN SITES:

The Colosseum, the Roman and Imperial Fora, Seven Hills of Rome, Tiber Island, Pantheon, Augustan Altar of Peace, Baths of Caracalla, Column of Marcus Aurelius, Villa Giulia, Museum of Etruscan Art, Palazzo Massimo, St. Peter's Basilica, Vatican Museums, and countless more. Let the history of Rome blow you away.
