What were your primary responsibilities as an intern?

As an intern at Fundación Catalina Muñoz, my primary responsibilities included the creation of text for an environmental portfolio and volunteer manual, research of international funding opportunities, and translation of documents into English. The focus of my internship was on the environmental component of the organization related to school gardens and community orchards.

What was your biggest accomplishment at your

I wish I knew that even though Colombia has a violent history that is very much in the consciousness of the people, there is an immense amount of beauty that the country embodies. Popular media tries to nullify and overshadow that beauty and culture yet through interacting with people and experiencing the culture that history can be taken into account alongside the vitality of Colombia.

What was the most memorable aspect of your internship experience?

The most memorable experiences were those in which I shared meals in community with co-workers and had opportunities to get to know them outside of work obligations. In these moments, I felt more connected and capable of nurturing relationships built upon genuine interest in each other's lives.
