<p>Intern Colombia has partnered with an NGO that was founded in 2007, thanks to a group of young people that decided to educate a new generation in Colombia about peace. They design, implement, and evaluate programs for peace education based on playful and reflection activities, to generate environments where participants explore different aspects of and problems of their daily lives, and they discover and practice different ways to handle them. Their main peace programs are: Human Rights Program, Conflict Resolution and Dialogue Program, and Leadership Program. Today more than 10,000 people have benefited from their programs.</p>

Educational Model	
<p>They work mainly with children, teenagers and teachers to create environments of peace, conflict management, leadership and innovation through workshops, recreational activities, and reflection.</p> <p>Teaching of Peace (<i>Addressed to Educational Institutions (primary, secondary and university)</i>) They fully or partially design the Chairs of Peace that, according to Law 1732, every educational institution in Colombia is obliged to teach. They have methodologies to educate for peace from different traditional subjects such as social sciences, natural sciences and mathematics, as well as workshop, seminar or conference style modalities.</p> <p>Diploma Educa for PEACE (<i>Addressed to Educators</i>) In this course educators receive more than 120 hours of training to develop the skills and activities necessary in their classes to promote convivial environments. They are the necessary tools to comply with the law promoted by the Teaching of Peace. <i>Modules: 1) General aspects of education for peace (Educational Policies) 2) The conflict: A space to think inside and outside the school 3) Conflict resolution in the classroom: A way of being at school. 4) The school as the foundation of PEACE.</i></p> <p>PEACE Multipliers Program: (<i>Addressed to Educators</i>) Virtual monitoring of teaching activity by expert tutors about peace and coexistence, so educators can ask questions, receive support and share with other teachers the experience in other educational contexts. Ideal for teachers and educators who are looking for tools to implement programs in their respective educational institutions.</p> <p>Community Workshops: (<i>Address to Children & Teenagers</i>) Workshops for children and teenagers which have a strong focus on: face-to-face activities, self-recognition and human rights, self-esteem, management of emotions, self-knowledge and good treatment, management and resolution of conflicts, tools for conflict management, management of school bullying, child and youth empowerment, and critical thinking.</p>
